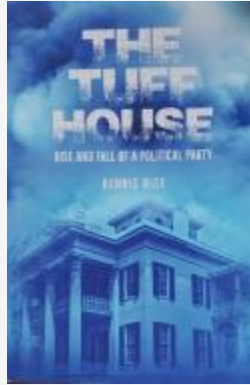


Review of The TUFF House

THE TUFF HOUSE: The Rise and Fall of a Political Party by Dennis Rice is a work of fiction. The focal theme of this book is centered on curbing crime and illegal activities and apprehending criminals after thorough investigations done with sheer determination. It also contains forms of violence, unlawful possession of ammunition, and the use of hard drugs.

This story starts with Raymond's sudden disappearance at Rebel Crossing.
